

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND CONTROL THE USE OF TOWNSHIP ROADS
FOR THE PURPOSE OF MOVING BUILDINGS THEREON.

The Board of Supervisors of the Township of Fayal do ordain as follows:

Section 1. No person, firm or corporation shall move or assist in moving a building along any cartway or road maintained in whole or in part by the Township of Fayal unless the same has been granted permission according to the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 2. Any person, firm or corporation desiring to procure permission to move a building as mentioned in Section 1 of this Ordinance shall apply therefor, in writing, to the Clerk of the Township of Fayal, stating specifically the route to be used, the exact time of movement, and agreeing that the applicant will faithfully observe and fully comply with all the terms and provisions of this Ordinance.

The Clerk of the Township of Fayal shall then issue such permit to such applicant; provided, that such applicant shall have first paid into the Treasury of the Township of Fayal the amount of deposit required by this Ordinance.

Section 3. The deposit for said permit required by this Ordinance shall be in the amount of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars.

Section 4. The sum of \$50.00 received by the Clerk shall be held by him in the Treasury until the Township Foreman has certified to him the amount of damage or expense caused by said movement to Township roads, telephone lines or other property, if any, and any balance remaining shall be returned to said applicant upon approval by the Township Board at a regular or special meeting.

Provided, that applicant shall be liable also for any damages to Township property in excess of the \$50.00 deposit.

Section 5. Any violation of this Ordinance shall be punishable by a fine not exceeding \$100.00, or by imprisonment in the County or Town Jail for a term not to exceed 30 days.

Section 6. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
